What is Two Coins-A-Meal?

“Two Coins” is a small step in the battle against hunger and poverty. Congregations invite every member of all ages to contribute a few coins at every meal. This simple act is an expression of thanksgiving for what we have received. When the members bring their offering to church on the appointed Sunday, all of those coins “make a joyful noise unto the Lord” as they are received and dedicated.

A History

The Presbytery of Lake Huron established our partnership with the FIEC, now the Presbyterian Church in Costa Rica (IEPC) in 1989. Hunger in the Costa Rican communities was recognized early as a growing problem, especially among children who make up more than a third of the population.

Since the beginning of Two Coins-A-Meal, the Presbytery has dedicated a major portion (now 55%) of the offering to help alleviate hunger in the IEPC communities in Costa Rica. Cost effective, but highly nutritious hot meals are currently served to more than 300 children weekly through 10 of the IEPC congregations.

Your “Two Coins” Offering And Its Lifegiving Impact

55%

55% of your offering is used to support IEPC hunger programs with children and the elderly in Costa Rica. For less than \$1, church volunteers serve a typical meal consisting of rice, beans, vegetables, a small portion of meat, salad and fruit to over 300 children weekly.

20%

20% is designated to the Presbyterian Hunger Program to respond to the crisis of hunger in the United States and around the world. PHP addresses hunger by providing direct food aid and by helping poor and hungry people help themselves through development assistance.

25%

25% is designated by your congregation to meet hunger needs in your local community.
